The [Florida High Tech Corridor Council](#) is an economic development initiative of the University of Central Florida (UCF), the University of South Florida (USF) and the University of Florida (UF) established in 1996 to attract, retain and grow high tech industry and the workforce to support it in a 23-county region. Recognized by numerous scientific and economic development organizations for its achievements, The Corridor Council facilitates public-private partnerships to support research, entrepreneurship, workforce and marketing efforts.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Matching Grants Research Program (MGRP)

Since 1996, the [MGRP](#) has generated downstream economic impacts of an estimated \$1 billion by fostering applied research between high tech companies and researchers from UCF and USF. Matching funds enable companies to maximize their budgets and tap into the expertise of faculty and student researchers. Students often become employees of the companies they work with in the program and industry partners routinely form lasting research relationships with the universities.

stemCONNECT

[stemCONNECT](#) inspires K-12 students to pursue high tech careers by engaging professionals to deliver presentations about their career fields and how STEM education applies. With online video conferencing tools, hundreds of students from across the region can participate in these interactive presentations, which often include exciting tours of research laboratories or modern workspaces. Since the first virtual session, stemCONNECT has exposed over 80,000 students and teachers to STEM career opportunities in modeling, simulation and training, life sciences and more.
